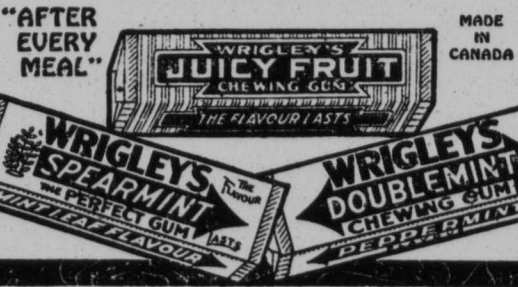

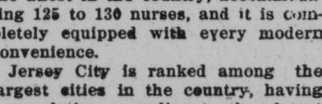
Take Notice that the Municipality of the County of Northumberland will apply at the next meeting of the Local Legislature to pass an Act to amend Chapter Two of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick 1903 entitled an Act Respecting the Division of the Province into Counties, Towns and Parishes by repealing the sections of the said act in which division of the Parishes of South Esk and Derby are stated and enacting the following amendments:

(111) Parish of South Esk—North and North East by North Esk west by the County line and South by a line commencing at the Canadian Government Railway Bridge across the North West Branch of the Miramichi River thence South along the said Railway to the Southern-side of the overhead bridge crossing the said railway thence in a westerly direction until it strikes the lower line of Thomas Young's lot at the South East Corner thereof thence westerly along the rear line of the grants bounded on South West Miramichi River to the rear of the Davidson grants thence on the same courses as the rear of the Davidson grants to the Blackville line thence along the parish lines of Blackville, Blissfield and Ludlow to the County Line.

(115) Derby West by Blackville North by South Esk east by the lower extremity of Beaubear's Island and to include the same and South by the South West Branch of the Miramichi River.
