The Sea Cow

The sea cow is not a cow at all, but only a distant cousin of the whale, that lives in the waters around the coast of Florida and in the warm waters of parts of the world. He is one of the strangest creatures in the world today. He gets his name sea ow, from his manner of grazing in herds on the grass on the bottom lakes and ponds. As far as anybody knows, he lives entirely on vegetab-les, as his teeth are like those of a cow and are fitted only for biting and chewing grass. His general shape is that of a fish; but he is not a fish, as he cannot stay all the time under water, but must come up every little while to breathe. 
