



Mail Under Difficulties.

In olden times there were various devices resorted to to establish mail communication over the water. The steamers from England for several years after the transatlantic service was established threw a can overboard off Cape Race in which the last English newspaper was enclosed, together with a synopsis of the state of British markets. A pigeon express was likewise established.

The day for this sending the news has not yet passed. The people of Magdalen Islands have adopted the plan of enclosing their letters in a barrel and sending it adrift on the waters. A barrel was picked up on the Cape Breton coast the other day which was found to contain between thirty and forty letters. These letters were received at the post office that night, and were transmitted to their respective addresses. It is the intention to send a similar barrel once a week.

The Magdalen Islands have adopted this plan because of the fact that the cable between the Islands and Cape Noth has become unworkable, and the opportunity has been taken from them of sending their messages by cable, and having them transmitted in due course through the mails.

Municipal Council.

The weekly meeting of the City Council took place last evening. Present: Mayor Gibbs, Councilors Martin, Kennedy, Collier and Cowan. James Spratt sent a letter complaining that the tax levied on theatrical shows was excessive. He with others were clubbed together giving shows to make money for themselves and the tax would prevent them from making as much as they expected to make. He showed that the expenses of a nickel show were \$354.30 per week. He asked that the tax be reduced.

D. Courtenay asked the Council to take up a consideration of his claim for damages by water flooding his cellar. The question was deferred.

J. Drew applied for leave to put a gas engine in his shop at King's Bridge. Referred to Engineer.

The application of Rob. Peary for the position of engineer on steam roller was placed on file.

W. J. Harris asked for information about sewerage on Bond St. Report will be got as to the cost also cost of sewer on Gower Street, near Cochrane Street.

P. C. O'Driscoll wrote offering pipes. He will be asked to send in an offer as to price at which he will supply them.

J. Leard asked for water and sewerage on Bond Street. He will get it when the weather is favorable.

The Angel Engineering Co. sent in plan of automobile shop on Water St. It will be a wooden building covered with iron. Ordered that they be informed of the law relating to buildings on Water Street.

Mr. Furlong asked permission to build a coach house on Central St. Deferred for report.

J. R. Johnson will not be allowed to extend shop and machinery on Prescott Street.

It was decided to write the Deep Sea Mission asking them to protect the sidewalk when building the new Hope.

The Gas Co. will be permitted to put crossing at the upper end of the Promenade.  
After the regular weekly reports were presented the meeting adjourned.

Masked Burglar Enters

Drawing-Room, Shoots One Woman Dead, Wounds Another, and Escapes.

Springfield, Mass., March 31.—His demand for money ignored, a masked burglar who had entered the drawing-room of the Dow homestead on Round Hill early this evening, shot and killed Miss Martha B. Blackstone, 39 years old, a guest, and a teacher in the Jefferson Avenue Primary School; and probably fatally wounded Miss Harriet P. Dow, a fellow teacher, in whose home the tragedy took place. Miss Blackstone was shot through the heart as she ran screaming into an adjacent room. Miss Dow was shot in the skull, which was fractured; trepanning will be resorted to in an effort to save her life. The murderer escaped.
