GERMANY AND HOLLAND. LONDON, April 8. Rumors are current in London to day of the declaration of hostilities between Germany and Holland. They were without confirmation, and de spatches from the Hague, received this afternoon, ignored such development. The Minister of the Netherlands in London, when asked, said he had not heard rumors to this effect. He had no information on the subject himself and he discredited the report. One rumor was to the effect that Germany had seized a strip of Dutch territory in the South Scheldt River. A telegram from Holland said that for several days the Germans had been strengthening their guard along the Dutch border.


