MILLERAND CONTUMACIOUS.

PARIS, April 12.

(By the A.P.)—Nothing has as yet
been decided as to Premier Miller-
and's attendance at the Supreme
Council meeting at San Remo, and it
was declared this morning, in reli-
able sources, that if the conference
there is to discuss the misunder-
standing between France and Great
Britain, he will not go at all. A per-
sonal talk on the subject with Prem-
ier Lloyd George would be welcomed
by the French Premier, if Mr. Lloyd
George could find it convenient to
come to Paris, but it is considered in
official circles that as the point at
issue interests France and Great
Britain only, it is needless to discuss
it before the representatives of other
powers. Premier Millerand's reply
to the latest British note has not yet
been made public, but it is declared
to make no material change in the
situation. It expresses regret that
there has been occasion for any con-
troversy, but it points out that if
France acted alone in her occupation
to move east of the Rhine, it was be-
cause she was left alone in the face
of a situation which required prompt
action. The note assures Great Brit-
ain that France is determined to re-
main faithful to the Alliance, but in-
timates that the Government cannot
promise to abstain from defending the
interests confided to it, when its
action is not contrary to the objects
of that Alliance.

Young Men's Meeting Postponed.

The meeting of young men, which
was to have been held in the Methodist
College Hall last evening, did not come
off. A big joint meeting was being held
in Gower Street Church, and it was
thought best to postpone the young
men's meeting, so that they should
not conflict. The meeting will be held
at a near date, to be announced later.

Boy Injured at Ropewalk.

An 18-year-old youth named Bar-
tlett, an employee of the Ropewalk,
was injured there this morning when
his arm got caught in a roller in the
yarn spinning department. The flesh
was torn and lacerated but no bones
were broken. A doctor, who was call-
ed, ordered the boy to hospital, where
the wound was dressed. The machine
was not the one at which he worked,
and in fact he had no business tamper-
ing with it.

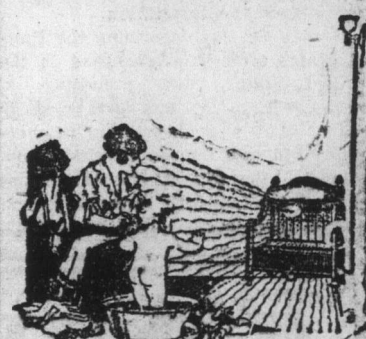
