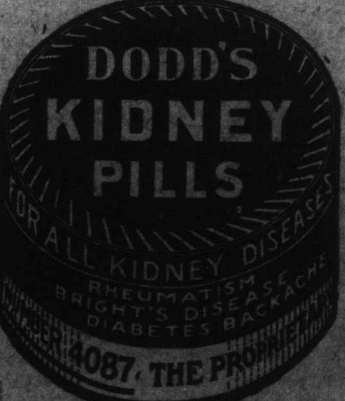

Sea Water and Bread.

SOLE FOOD OF GREEK REFUGEES.
CONSTANTINOPLE—(Associated Press)—Living for sixteen days on mixed sea and fresh water and limited bread rations, 800 children and 4,000 adult Greeks have arrived here on the Greek steamer Michael Archangel from Novorossiysk, Russia, with no food or water on board. Suffering from cholera and other epidemic diseases, many of the refugees were ill and two had died at sea. Greek military authorities and delegates of the Greek High Commission inspected the ship, supplied medical aid and arranged for emergency food supplies to last the vessel until she reached Saloniki, where the able-bodied will be debarked for transportation to the tobacco farms and road camps in the vicinity of Kavala. These refugees were recruited from among more than 20,000 Greeks who were driven from their homes by the Bolsheviks and who have been waiting two years for repatriation. The condition of the others is said to be serious, with from 25 to 30 dying daily of hunger.

**Carries Heart
On Right Side.**

FORT WILLIAM, Ont., (Canadian Press)—A rare instance of anatomical misplacement was disclosed by an X-ray photograph here recently, which showed the heart of Mrs. D. R. Latreille of this city, on the opposite side to that where normal people keep the seat of their affections. While this is a rare thing, local physicians state that occasionally the heart is displaced by some affection of the lungs and cases have been known in which the heart was situated on the right side and the appendix on the left in persons who seemed otherwise quite normal. Mrs. Latreille states she has never felt the slightest inconvenience from her abnormal condition; and, though she has a family of children she does not think that any of them have inherited the peculiarity. Mrs. Latreille brought a strong protest from one of her school-age children not long ago when she placed her hand upon her right side when complaining of a heart-pain. "Why," she exclaimed the child, "you ought to be old enough to know where your heart is." Later, however, the X-ray in a local hospital revealed that mother was quite correct.

**Soy Bean Rivals Silk
As Chinese Export.**

Cultivation of the soy bean has developed in China to such an extent that it now represents the principal agricultural industry of that country. Immense areas of the great plains of southern Manchuria are devoted to this crop. The world's demand for soy beans is steadily increasing and China's export of them bids fair soon to surpass in value that of its silk output. There are more than 1000 varieties of soy beans, from which an experiment station at Kung-chu-ling, in southern Manchuria, has chosen one as the best of all. It is nearly spherical, yellow in colour and of the bigness of a small pea. A yield of 32 percent of oil is extracted from it. The soy bean yields milk and butter (or products equivalent for table use), as well as a great variety of other edibles, including a famous sauce. Taken all in all, the five ounce bean is one of our most versatile vegetables.
