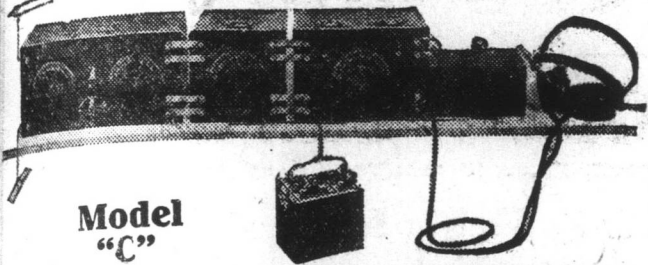

Another Railway project.

SHORT WHEAT ROUTE ACROSS NEWFOUNDLAND. A project that will facilitate the movement, across the water, of Canadian wheat is under consideration and should the present plans mature Newfoundland will have a double track broad gauge railway across the Northern Peninsula with a terminus at Bonton. The promoter of the scheme is at present in the city, having arrived by express last week. A railway tapping the wheat fields of Northern Canada and running along the coast of Canadian Labrador with a train ferry service across the Straits is a part of the plan. The visit of the promoter who is said to have ample backing, is to seek certain concessions, necessary to the undertaking, from the Government.

The steamers to be classed X 100 A1 at Lloyd's (England), and to have a speed of at least 12 knots. They must have about 2000 tons dead-weight capacity, be fitted with all modern improvements, and have first class passenger accommodation for 20 persons.

Under the proposed service a steamer will leave St. John's every 3 weeks, calling at Havana, Jamaica, Porto Rico, Martinique, Barbados, Trinidad and other islands in the West Indies, making one call each trip at the above ports. The service to be continuous throughout the whole of each year, and the contract to be for a term of 5 years to be computed from the date of commencement of the service. Corrects "Saturday Night."

The Evening Telegram.

The Telegram of July 29th published an extract from the Saturday Night, containing a representation of the facts concerning the introduction of the International Typographical Union in an effort to gain for its members the forty-four hour work week. The article states that in the week ending June 24th, the members of the union were paid in the sum of \$3,500,000 which sum \$3,800,000 has been expended to maintain those on strike. It is plainly an error on the part of Saturday Night's statistician, whose article evidently outweighs his own in all his arguments on this point. As there has been considerable misunderstanding in circles where such matters are discussed, and your permission I will give a few figures taken from the official reports of the organization's chief as published in the International Typographical Journal. To the end of June the receipts for strike relief amounted to \$10,021,000, and the expenses incident thereto totalled \$9,493,968.08. Five hundred and twelve typographical unions have established the forty-four hour week in their jurisdictions resulting in a membership of approximately 41,641, and at the time the strike letter was written (June 24th) there were but 7,050 men and women on the strike roll, with strikes continuing in 170 cities. There has been no suggestion whatever from the International officers of the International Typographical Union of the strike, as intimated in Saturday Night. In conclusion, Mr. Editor, let me say that at the present time where many of our young men are contemplating a change of work, which means a release from present chaotic business conditions, he can carry no better credentials (with one exception, perhaps) than that supplied by the International Union in the shape of a travelling card. Hence his loyalty to his union. The exception is an unlimited supply of gold cash.

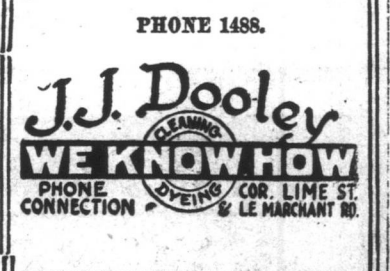
