Called on Friday night to put to death a dog which had been run over by a horse and express on Buchanan St. The dog had its back broken. Another on Sunday morning, which had been run over by a motor on the corner of New Gower and Springdale St. Received a report of another being killed by a motor on Waterford Bridge Road. Called on Saturday night at twelve o'clock to put to death a horse which was very old and had passed its labour. Also a horse owned by a resident of Mount Pearl Road suffering from some internal trouble. The owner called to have it humanely put to death. Four horses have been taken off the street for lameness. Attended a sale of cattle at the Abattoir Coy's. All the cattle were taken delivery of immediately after sale. Looked after the horses hauling heavy loads of machinery. Those hauling sand and stone at the dock I have no complaints to make about them. There seems to be a lot of trouble of late. The boys under age doing express work with ponies and small horses. I think according to the law, the driver must be thirteen years of age. There are also some complaints about lame horses, some of them are in good condition and are lame through natural causes, such as sprain and colic. I do my best in warning owners not to drive too fast, and to be as careful as possible with them. Two horses complained of, one with broken knees and blind doing express work, will have the Veterinary's opinion. All complaints, so far as I know have been attended to. Thankful for all who take an interest in the work. There has been quite an epidemic among horses in Montreal. Below is an extract from a Canadian paper. Please phone all complaints of cruelty.
