# FOR SUPREME COURT

New York's Celebrated Reform Governor Succeeds Late Justice Brewer.

Albany, April 26.-Gov. Charles Hughes decided to accept the appointment by President Taft as a United States supreme court justice, in preference to returning to the practice of law in New York city on Jan. 1 next.

The salary of governor is \$10,000, and that of a United States supreme court ustice \$12,500. The latter salary is to be ncreased shortly to \$17,500. Gov. Hughes feels that in accepting this life appoint-ment from President Taft that he will be able to live within his income and save some money, as the position will not entail any material social obligations or expenditures, such as the governor-

ship or the presidency. As Gov. Hughes will ascend the supreme court bench at Washington at the commencement of the second week in October, he will not be a factor in next fall's campaign in this state. He will be suceeded as governor by Lieut.-Gov. White. The governor is now in the prime of life, 48 years old, and the steady, regular work of the court conduces to longevity, as experience shows, and unless there is something, such as disease, or some accident occur, the chances are that there will be twenty or more years' of work there for him. Chicago, April 26. - Charles Moran, better known as "Chappy" Moran, alleged by Postoffice Inspector Stuart, of Chicago, and Inspector J. T. Cortelyou, of Philadelphia, to be the dean of American swindlers, is under arrest awaiting removal to Philadelphia. The arrest was made Saturday, but was kept secret until the arrival of Cortelyou.
