SUDDEN DEATH OF MRS. FLORA BENNETT

Funeral Will Be Held on Saturday to Woodland.

The funeral of Mrs. Flora Bennett, widow of Charles E. Bennett, who died suddenly at her home, 358 Elias street, Wednesday afternoon, is to be held tomorrow at 2:30 p.m. to Woodland Cemetery, when the services will be conducted by Rev. Mr. McIntosh, of King Street Presbyterian Church.

Thomas Moore, an employee of the C. E. R. who performs night duty, arose at 5 o'clock Wednesday afternoon and discovered his mother lying in bed. When unable to awaken her he summoned a physician, who found that life had been extinct for some time. Coroner Dr. MacLaren was later notified, but decided that death was due to either heart weakness or acute indigestion, and an inquest was therefore unnecessary.

Mrs. Bennett had been in ill health for some time and had been under the care of a physician. She is survived by three sons—Harry, of this city, and James and Thomas at home.

POOLS FOR BOYS IN THE RIVER

Board of Works Will Go Ahead With Two Swimming Places at Once.

PAVING STANLEY STREET

People Object, and So Do the Street Railway—Meeting of the Board of Works.

At the meeting of the board of works on Thursday night Engineer Wright was instructed to prepare plans for two swimming pools in the river for the boys of the city. The pools, it is expected, will be situated in the north and south branches, and will be roped off and a competent supervisor will be put in charge of each.

The committee thought that the grant of \$500, sanctioned by the council, would fully cover the cost of erecting a shelter of the knock-down type; the salaries of the supervisors, which will be about \$12 per week for eight weeks, and the cost of the ropes. Everything will be constructed so that it can be stored away during the winter, and erected quickly each spring.

A letter was read from Mr. Geo. S. Gibbons, president of the London Playgrounds and Recreation Association, in which he heartily concurred with the decision of the committee that the swimming baths should be under the supervision of the municipal authorities.

Paving Stanley Street.

The committee referred the question of paving Stanley street back to the council. A petition signed by a large number of the ratepayers was received asking that the pavement be not laid, as the street was not a main thoroughfare, and would be made such by the laying of a pavement. Manager C. B. King, of the street railway, stated that the company was not prepared for the installation of new rails, which would be necessitated if a pavement was laid.

A complaint was received through Messrs. Jarvis & Vining from certain citizens of Trafalgar street, stating that the McClary Manufacturing Company, by extending a railroad siding, had encroached upon the street. Legal action was threatened if the street was not immediately put in proper condition. The matter was referred to City Solicitor Meredith.

P. E. Osborne asked that the city further consider his claim for damages amounting to \$255, caused by him running into a sewer on Richmond

street north last fall while driving his automobile. The matter will be given further consideration.

A New Mill.

W. J. Plevies asked permission of the board to erect a 2½-story veneer storehouse and feed mill at the corner of Talbot and Bathurst streets, but as the plans showed that the contemplated construction of the building was contrary to the city bylaws, the request was filed.

The London Rolling Mills requested that two hundred feet of Philip street in front of their premises be oilied at their expense. The matter was referred to the city engineer with power.

A letter was read from Mr. A. M. Smart requesting that the council initiate a cement curb and gutter on Kent street, between Richmond and Talbot streets. Mr. George Gunn was present at the meeting, and stated that the majority of the ratepayers were in favor of this move. The committee was in favor of the request and will support it at the meeting of the city council.

Curbs and Gutters.

Engineer Wright recommended that the council authorize the laying of cement curbs and gutters on Wellington street, from Dufferin avenue to Queen's avenue, so that Wellington street from Pall Mall street to Queen's avenue will be completed as far as curbs and gutters are concerned. He also recommended that a curb and gutter be laid on the south side of Dufferin avenue, between Park avenue and Wellington street.

A communication was received from Mr. Whit Lancaster re the completion of the pavement on Dundas street between Ridout and Kensington bridge. Mr. Lancaster made a proposal to the city, which, if accepted, will do away with the grounds of the dispute. The
