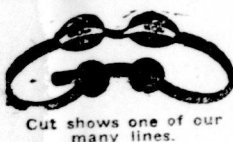

OPPOSES JUDGES ON COMMISSION

Hon. Howard G. Ferguson
Raises Voice in Pro-
test.

RANEY MAKES STATEMENT

Attorney-General Declares
Drury Will Outline Chippawa
Probe Plans.

TORONTO, April 3.—Hon. Howard G. Ferguson announced in the Legislature this afternoon that he would strenuously oppose the appointment of a member of the judiciary to serve on a commission conducting a "semi-political" investigation. He referred particularly to a report that a number of judges had been asked to serve on a commission which will investigate the Chippawa project, and claimed that when judges served on such probes they became open to justifiable attacks, and he strongly objected to the judiciary being dragged into any position which might endanger respect and confidence which all wished people to have in courts of this province.

Premier Drury was not in the house at the time, but Attorney-General Raneley said the government had no present intention of appointing a judge to head the commission. He, however, declined to make further statements in this connection in view of Premier Drury's intention of making a statement in full, forming the house regarding the scope of the inquiry and personnel of the commission sometime this week.

The Legislature did not open until 4 o'clock, out of respect for the memory of Sir John C. Eaton. Although an hour late in starting, it made good progress in dealing with private bills. Bills respecting the Village of Watford, City of Niagara Falls and the Town of Mimico went through committee of house, and nine were given second readings. They were mostly non-contentious and having only local application.

Premier Drury announced that the public accounts committee would be assembled on Wednesday next.

INVITES TO FILM SHOW

Listowel Mayor Requests Children of
Ministerial Association To
Attend Presentation.

LISTOWEL, April 3.—The regular monthly meeting of the Ministerial Association was held this afternoon in the Methodist Church. Ensign W. H. Stevens of the Salvation Army gave an address on "The Personal Element in Revivals." An invitation was sent by Mayor A. E. Malcolm to the association for all the S. S. children, officers and teachers to attend a moving picture, entitled "From the Manger to the Cross," to be given in Knox Church, Friday, April 21. This invitation was accepted and the secretary asked to accept it and express appreciation for the same to the mayor.

URGE AGRICULTURAL BANK.

WASHINGTON, April 3.—Creation of a federal institution similar to the Federal Reserve Bank system to provide long-term credits for farmers was proposed in a bill introduced in the Senate today. The bill would set up an agricultural banking system with regional districts and other attributes of the federal banking system.

GOVERNMENT DECIDES M. S. A. LEGALLY DEAD

Woodsworth Bill To Repeal Con-
scription Act Held To Be Un-
necessary.

OTTAWA, April 3.—(By Canadian Press.)—The military service act of 1917 is dead. The prime minister, the leader of the opposition and the Speaker of the house tonight united in pronouncing its obsequies.

J. S. Woodsworth, Labor member from Winnipeg Center, had "a bill to repeal the act." There was some doubt, he said, whether it was operative or not. If it were dead it should at least be given decent burial. Mr. Woodsworth spoke but a few minutes. He was immediately followed by Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, the prime

minister, who read legal opinions in support of his contention that the bill still been operative the government would have been only too glad to act on the repealing of it, but the act was dead.

A subsequent speech by Right Hon. A. Meighen, leader of the opposition, led to a sharp encounter. Mr. Meighen contended that the act was inapplicable to any war but the past war. But he complained, the fact that it had not been repealed was used as a basis for bitter assault during the election campaign against members of his administration.

OIL FIRE STOPS TRAIN.

SAPULPA, Okla., April 3.—All traffic on the St. Louis and San Francisco Railroad from Tulsa to Oklahoma City was stopped this afternoon when a fourth oil tank at the Sapulpa Refining Company near here caught fire. More than 200,000 barrels of oil spread over a large area are burning and additional storage tanks are in danger.

BUILDING BOOM BEGINS IN GALT

GALT, April 2.—One of the most encouraging signs for the return of normal conditions is the increase in building activities, as indicated by the building permits to date.

For March past sixteen permits

six of them for new dwellings and one for a \$15,000 addition to the Riverside silk mills, were issued, representing a total value of \$31,757.50, while for the same period last year the value of the permits issued was \$14,650.

DENY ASSISTANCE ASKED BY MINERS

CLEVELAND, O., April 3.—Denial of reports that requests for financial assistance had been addressed by the striking union miners to the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen was made today by W. G. Lee, president of the brotherhood. "The miners have made no appeal for aid to us," he said. "If they do I feel sure trainmen will do their part."

Mr. Lee denied reports that the brotherhood would be represented at the meeting in Chicago or at any else to consider what could be done to help the miners.

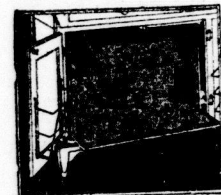

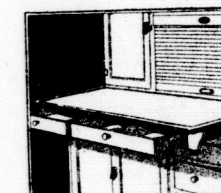

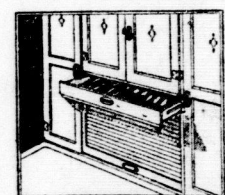
