At Toronto, out of a population of 84,484 persons, there are 289 shareholders, holding in the aggregate 101,735 shares, which represent a total capital of £1,017,850, the average holding being 352 shares.

At Montreal, population 140,863, 99 shareholders hold 23,850 shares, or £238,500; average holding 238 shares.

At Niagara, three holders have 2500 shares, representing £25,000; average 833 shares.

At Winnipeg, 15 persons hold 2177 shares, representing a liability of £21,770; average 141 shares.

At Port Hope, population 4584, 6 persons hold 3700 shares, or £37,000; average 616 shares.
