One amendment adopted at the recent session greatly reduces the number of naturalized persons who have to obtain a voting certificate before being entitled to vote. The only naturalized persons now required to obtain such a certificate are alien women born outside of North America who are the wives or unmarried widows of British subjects, natural born or naturalized, but any of these who are entitled to vote under the War Time Elections Act of 1917 do not

require a certificate. The new Election Act of 1920, before being amended this year, made it necessary that the thousands of persons who became naturalized by process of law simply because their fathers were naturalized, should before voting obtain a voting certificate from a judge. This has been abolished.
