CORN STARCH CAKE.—One cup butter, two cups sugar; one cup sweet milk; whites of six eggs; two cups flour; one cup com starch, and two teaspoonfuls of baking staren, and two teaspo powder; flavour to taste.

CRAW-APPLE PRESERVES. apples; then remove them from the water, and to every pound of apples add a pound of sugar. Put the apples and sugar over the fire, and cook slowly till the full is tender.

CRAB-APPLE JELLY.—Put the apples into water enough to cover them, and boil until they crack open. Strain off the juice, measure and add granulated sugar in the proportion of a pint of sugar to a pint of juice. Boil twenty minutes.

fruit Saucas.—These are all very tich and delicious, for puddings, and used as a garnish also, they add greatly to the beauty of the pudding when ready for serving. The preserve juice is to be somewhat thickened with corn starch and boiled; then the fruit thrown in, and poured all over the pudding together. Marmalades and stiff jellies make good gamishes for pudding.

WHIPPED CREAM SAUCE .- Have a plate whiteped Cream Sauck.—Have a plate full of whiteped cream highly flavoured; add the beaten whites of two or three eggs, and powdered sugar to the taste.
