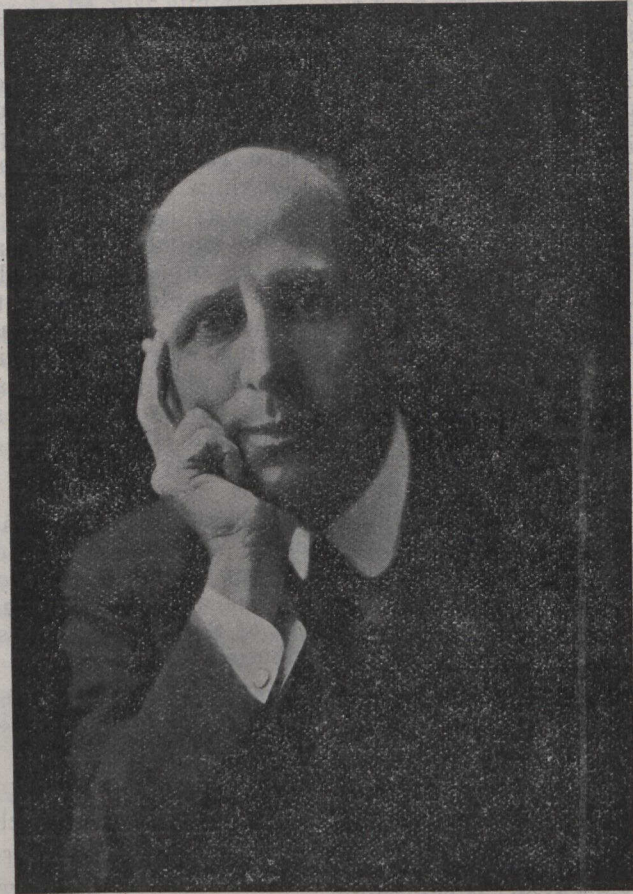


Civilian Portraits.

MR. GORDON ROGERS.

Mr. Gordon Rogers was born 17th May, 1868, and entered the Civil Service (Dept. of Interior) in 1880. He entered the Department of Agriculture as assistant private secretary to Honourable John Carling, in 1890, and has served in same capacity to other Ministers of Agriculture,—Hon. A. R. Angers and Hon. Mr. Montague—and as acting private secretary to Senator Ferguson. Also as secretary to Dr. Jas. W. Robertson, Commissioner of Agriculture, and to Mr. Geo. F. O'Halloran, Deputy Minister of Agriculture. His present position is that of secre-

tary to Dr. F. Montizambert, I.S.O. Director-General of Public Health and Sanitary Adviser of the Dominion Government.

In sport Mr. Rogers was identified as a youngster with the Ottawa Canoe Club, being one of the first and the youngest members of the club, and having the fortune of winning the first paddling race (1 mile, with a turn, out of a field of ten) held by the club. The start was from where is now the Alexandra bridge, along the Quebec side, for half a mile down, the "audience" being on Nepean Point. He has also won sev-
