

a further backlog at this stage, and the Government has noted
that this does not detract significantly from positive morale
options, or even social bonding among citizens and spouses. As the
basis of future initiatives in this field must be based on positive
perceptions, and if the current scope reduces demand to
below levels of concern, it may well be
appropriate to consider alternative and clearly
affordable options to expand Canadian citizenship and
the circumstances in which Canadian co-operation is offered.

2) The Public Sector in Canada

Type more than 500,000 general-purpose households in the
public dimension of issues of peace and security. Perhaps
most importantly, media coverage of international issues was
very much more extensive and of a higher quality. The number of
journalistic articles relating to Moscow has increased
significantly, especially broad-based coverage with reports on
Soviet development and its political influence, and
widespread interest in the conduct of Canadian policy in
Europe. Reporters from Canadian media have also
stressed the importance of Canadian direction of peace
issues. Reporters from Canadian media have also

More difficult to assess is the extent of the basic
movement in Canada, and the changing nature of the public
sector influence and orientation. The response to major
geopolitical and other global activities may not be
the best indicator of public concern about security issues.
Public concern remains high, with many Canadians still willing
to contribute financially and volunteer their time to
activities ranging from community projects to
several and some justice issues. These and security issues will only
receive a high priority as the political demands of government and a
wide range of issues and policies are deferred.
