SIR,

In connexion with the Agreement for Air Services signed today between the Government of Canada and the Government of the United Kingdom and the Notes concerning new arrangements for the Canadian service to the Caribbean exchanged to-day, I have the honour to state that my signature on behalf of the Government of the United Kingdom is, in respect of Bermuda and the Bahamas, subject to subsequent approval by the legislatures of those Colonies. It is, however, understood that, pending this approval, no objection will be raised by the authorities concerned to the exercise at Bermuda and the Bahamas the privileges granted under the Agreement and the Exchange of Notes to the airline or airlines designated by the Government of Canada for route 2 in Section I of the Schedule to the Agreement.

2. If this arrangement is acceptable to the Government of Canada, I have the honor to suggest that this Note and your reply should constitute an agreement to that effect between our two Governments.
