Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 43, Mr. Trudeau, seconded by Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton), moved,—That the House approves the action of the government in invoking the powers of the War Measures Act to meet the state of apprehended insurrection in the Province of Quebec as communicated to the Prime Minister by the Government of Quebec and the civic authorities of Montreal and further approves the orders and regulations tabled today by the Prime Minister on the clear understanding that the proclamation invoking the powers as contained in the regulations will be revoked on or before April 30, 1971 unless a resolution authorizing their extension beyond the date specified has been approved by the House.
