## BUSINESS OF THE HOUSE

Mr. Chevrier: Mr. Speaker, may I inquire from the Minister of Public Works who is again the genial leader of the house what he proposes as the items of business for tomorrow?

Mr. Green: Mr. Speaker, tomorrow we intend to ask for interim supply and following that, through an arrangement between the parties, we should like to take the resolution preceding a measure to provide for the temporary extension of the seasonal benefits under the Unemployment Insurance Act for a six weeks period from May 18 to June 28 of this year. As hon, members will realize the present benefits expire on the 15th so we would like to get this measure right through third reading as it still would have to go through the other place.

We intend to follow that with the resolution preceding a bill to amend the National Housing Act in respect to only one section, in fact, subsection 1 of section 22, the purpose of the legislation being to increase the amount available under that section from \$400 million to \$750 million. There is urgency there, too, because until we get this additional money we cannot continue with our small homes loan program.

Mr. Chevrier: May I ask if it is the intention to interrupt the debate on the address in reply to the speech from the throne until these three measures have been passed?

Mr. Green: That is the intention at the present time, Mr. Speaker.
