saying that I think all of us in this House are concerned with and appreciate the problems in the agricultural industry which the hon. Member has described. But I think he is perhaps taking a rather narrow approach to the whole matter and that the setting up of a Royal Commission as the hon. Member requests, while this in itself might be helpful. would entail wasting a great deal of time, pending the inquiry and the report of the Commission, before the Government would be in a position to take action in this respect. Also, there are indeed other facets of the problem facing the agricultural industry today that are of equal concern, and the whole scope of the agricultural problem is one which the Government has under constant review. The legislation introduced—I shall refer later in my remarks to this legislation and the policies of this Government-has been helpful in approaching a solution to this problem.

Mr. Russell C. Honey (Durham): Mr. in this particular field. The hon.
