REGIONAL ECONOMIC EXPANSION—ATLANTIC CANADA— REQUEST FOR MASSIVE CAPITAL INVESTMENT IN LARGE INFRASTRUCTURES

Mr. J. Robert Howie (York-Sunbury): Mr. Speaker, on March 28, 1973, I asked the Minister of Regional Economic Expansion (Mr. Jamieson) to consider certain infrastructures involving massive capital investment, such as a corridor road from McAdam, New Brunswick to Sherbrooke, Quebec. The corridor road would be a straight line highway through the state of Maine from the province of New Brunswick, and would be created by the extension of the Vanceboro-Lincoln road at the New Brunswick border to the outskirts of Sherbrooke in Quebec. Over such a road it would be some 400 miles from Fredericton to Montreal, compared with nearly 600 miles at the present time over Canadian highways or some 540 miles driving through the United States.

In addition to saving on distance, there is a great reduction in time involved. This is a factor of considerable importance where trucking costs are involved. At the present time, using either the Canadian or American routes there is a distance of approximately 665 miles from the port of Saint John, New Brunswick, to Montreal, Quebec. The corridor road would reduce this by approximately 200 miles in distance and about four hours in time.
