XIV. Provided alfo, and be it enacled by the authority aforefaid, That every Ordinance fo to be made, fhall, within fix months, be transmitted by the Governor, or, in his absence, by the Licutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, and laid before his Majefly for his Royal approbation; and if his Majefly shalt think fit to difallow thereof; the fame shall cease and be void from the time that his-Majefly's Order in Council thereupon shall be promulgated at Quebce.

XV. Provided alfo, That no Ordinance touching Religion, or by which any punifhment may be inflicted greater. than fine or imprifonment for three months, fhalli be of any force or effect, until the fame shall have received his Majesty's approbation.

XVI. Provided alfo, That no Ordinance shall be passed at any meeting of the Council where less than a majority of the whole Council is prefent, or at any times except between the first day of January and the first day of May, unless upon some urgent occasion, in which case every member thereof resident at Quebec, or withinfifty miles thereof, shall be perforally summoned by the Governor, or, in his absence, by the Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, to attend t the same.

XVII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That nothing herein contained thall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent or hinder his Majefty, his heirs and fucceffors, by his or their Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Great Britain, from erecting, confituting, and appointing, fuch courts of criminal, civil, and ecclefiaftical jurildiction within and for the faid province of Quebec, and appointing, from time to time, the Judges and Officers thereof, as his Majefty, his heirs and fucceffors, fhall think necellary and proper for the circumflances of the faid province.

XVIII. Provided always, and it is hereby enacted. That nothing in this Act contained shall extend, or be confluted to extend, to repeal or make void, within the faid province of Quebec, any Act or Acts of the Parliament of Great Britain heretofore made, for prohibiting, refliaining, or regulating, the trade or commerce of his Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America; but that all and every the faid Acts, and allo all Acts of Parliament heretofore made concerning of respecting the faid Colonies and Plantations, shall be, and are hereby declared to be in force, within the faid Province of Quebec, and every part thereof. fi fi feroi pub X laqu fonn l'apj
