of his embassy, to take the conduct of my assairs in Spain, the obligations I lie under would be very great. During five years, that gentleman has carried on refearches for my behoof, with fuch activity, perfeverance, and knowledge of the fubject, to which his attention was turned, as have filled me with no less assonishment than fatisfaction. He procured for me the greater part of the Spanish books, which I have consulted; and as many them of were printed early in the fixteenth century, and are become extremely rare, the collecting of these was such an occupation, as, alone, required much time and assiduity. To his friendly attention I am indebted for copies of feveral valuable manuferipts, containing facts and details which I might have fearched for in vain, in works that have been made public. Encouraged by the inviting good-will with which Mr. Waddilove conferred his favours, I transmited to him a fet of queries, with respect both to the customs and policy of the native Americans, and the nature of feveral inflitutions in the Spanish fettlements, framed in fuch a manner, that a Spaniard might anfwer them, without difclosing any thing that was improper to be communicated to a foreigner. He translated these into Spanish, and obtained from various perfons who had refided in most of the Spanish colonies, fuch replies as have afforded me much instruction.
