

**ONTARIO ARTISTS** 

Staples' September Mist" One of the Finest Paintings Yet Hung.

### FORTY-SECOND EXHIBIT

Warrants More Than Faint Praise - Eight Pieces of Sculpture Shown.

Above the average is the faint praise oraise with which many local art exhibiions have been damned in the past, but here can be no such milk and water engation meted out to the fortyecond annual exhibition of the Ontario society of Artists, which opened last light in the public library on College street. The attendance was socially orimant, and many leading academic, iterary, artistic and professional people were present. The usual introductory ceremony was omitted, apparently without regret, and the guests were received by the president and Mrs. C. W. Jenterys, and the vice-president and treasurer, F. H. Briggen. The salons were crowded by 9 0 cook and there was but one opinion of the general excellence and high standard of the exhibit.

Malcolm Cuits' 'A Welsh Mooriand' (36), a giorious plece of lanascape, instinct with light and verual freshness, and conveying an inspiring uplitht, or the same artist's gorgeous plece of marine work, 'Atlantic Breakers' (35), with all the flood and fury, or rock surges under a breaking sky-light; or Owen Staples' 'October Mist' (133), one of he really big hings, which Toronto people should see to appreciate what lies at their doors for people with eyes; or Mrs. Knowles' 'On the Hill Top' (90), a nocturne of exquisite and tranquil beauty; or the wonderful color and feeling in A. Suzor Cote's 'Corner of My Village, Arthabaska, 2'' (17), and 'Thawing, March Evening' (18); or A. M. Fleming's sketch, less elaborated than usual, 'Fog Lifting' (4), Another feature of the exhibition is a new poase of the versatility evinced by G. A. Reid in such quite unexpected fashion in treatment as he has adopted in "Golden Rod" (120), which, as one visitor remarked, was for the platty evinced by the hay fever. ## HOMESTEAD PLAN FOR IRISH LANDS

Thomas Long Has Pointers for Redmond — United Irish League Election.

"Redmond should propose to the British Government a plan by which the land of Ireland could be bought back from the landowners at a fair price and given out again as homesteads," declared Patron Thomas Long at the annual meeting of the United Irish League, held in the King Edward Hotel last night. "In 1851, when I left Ireland," he

said, "there were \$,000,000 people there; now there are less than 4,000,-000. The strong men have gone, only the very old and the very young are at home. Whereas 65 per cent. of the land was under cultivation half century ago, less than 25 per cent. now being worked.
