While the Island of Corsica derives its fame from being the birthplace of Napoleon, the name of Pasquale de Paoli is more dear to the natives, for it was under the leadership of this patriot, in 1755, that they escaped from the yoke of the Genoese. For fourteen years he wisely administered the affairs of the island. In 1769 France bought the island from Genoa and landed an army of 22,000, which Paoli met with a few thousand Corsicans and fought until his army was reduced to 587 men; yet he cut his way thru and escaped to England, where he remained twenty years. At the outbreak of the revolution in France he returned to his native land and became military governor, but he could not get on with his old enemy, so he returned to England, where he died in 1807.
