

NURSERY HANDICAP TO SHARPSHOOTER

Best Youngsters of Year Con-
test at Belmont Park—Im-
proved Program.

NEW YORK, Sept. 17.—The program today was a bit better both in quality and general rule of late, the result being that the races on the whole were rather of an enjoyable kind. The headliner of the afternoon's sport was the Nursery Handicap, for two-year-olds at six furlongs. Some of the season's best youngsters took part. It was a good contest, and it was only in the closing stride that Sharpshooter was able to get his head in front and gain the decision. Coming down the chute the field raced in close order until the final three-sixteenths, where Coquette swerved over and knocked Sharpshooter off his stride. CAMDEN HORSES WIN
Three at Lexington

LEXINGTON, Ky., Sept. 17.—Ideal weather, coupled with perfect track conditions and a fairly good racing card, served to draw another large crowd to the Kentucky Association course this afternoon. Speculation reached a new high volume for a fall meeting, and the favorites got the worst of it. The choices were not won at prohibitive odds, two of them, Solly and Leo Skolney, paying less than 1 to 2. The colors of Senator Johnson N. Camden were seen from the front line times during the afternoon with Solly, One Step and Caurina. These horses were piloted by the Camden stable rider, Walter Taylor. This marked the first real success of the Camden stable since last spring on the Kentucky circuit, as the horses did little in the east during the past summer.
