Such an important and serious undertaking makes it necessary for me to make a trip of a few weeks in the Province of Quebec, and the 3rd of January next has been fixed for my departure. The Very Rev. J. N. Richot, cure of St. Nobert, is commissioned during my abecnos to administer the affairs of the discess jointly with the Rev. Father Poitras, O. M. I., of the Archbishop's Palece, to whom all correspondence and requests for dispensation, etc., should be addressed. Your fervent prayers offered each day to God for the triumph of the secred cause of the Catholic schools of Manitoba and of the Northwest Territories will be continued for me, as I entertain the sweet hope for the success of my journey which I am on the eve of taking for this end alone. With my wishes for a good, happy and hely New Year, kindly accept the assurance of my entire and respectful devetion in our Lord and Mary Immeculate. (Signed) J. ALLARD, O.M.I., Administrator.


