If we consider Haig's Army, which is the largest of all the Allied armies in the field; if we regard Britain's industrial effort in the production of munitions and other supplies for her Allies as well as for herself; if we look upon the British mercantile marine, which has carried 20,000,000 troops and enormous quantities of Ally supplies to the war zone; if we remember that the efficiency of the British Navy has made the continuance of the Allies in the war possible ever since the first week of the conflict—if we keep all these things in mind we must admit that Great Britain's contribution to the Entente cause is
