## Victoria, B. C.



OR THE VISITOR to Victoria, who wishes to see the many beautiful and interesting points of the City and surrounding country, no better means can be employed than a trip over the lines of the B. C. Electric Railway Company either by the Observation car or by regular passenger service. During the summer the Observation Car runs twice a day and takes about three hours, giving passengers the opportunity of visiting every point between Esquimalt and Oak Bay; and the Conductor gives racy notes upon all points passed.

Esquimalt is the key to Britain's naval strength upon the Pacific Coast. A twenty minute run from the centre of the City through a beautiful residential section brings one to the site of the fortress and to the Dry Dock, where ocean vessels are repaired. Along the shores of the harbor are located ship yards, canneries, lime works and other industries. An immense dry dock will very shortly be constructed, which, when finished, will make Esquimalt one of the most important centres of indus
