TORONTO BOXERS FOR BOSTON

Secretary Crow of C.A.A.U. Suggests Trip for City Tourney Winners.

The boxing championship meeting of the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States takes place in Mechanics' Building, Boston, on Monday and Tuesday evenings, April 22 and 23. This is right after the city tournament dates in the Mutualstreet club, and Secretary Crow of the C.A.A.U. believes it would be opportune to send these winners to the Boston tournament. Crow wrote to George V. Brown of the Boston Athletic Association, secretary of the American Union championship, asking what he thought of the proposition. This would be a nice trip for the Toronto winners. The failure of the men here is well known. Not a Canadian championship went outside this spring, and the city tournament champions would surely do well in the Boston being held.

Many of the contestants at the Argonauts' tournament kept right on training, and with the several men that will probably make their debut in the spring and fall, a big entry in each of the eight classes is assured.

T.M.C.B. Against Masons.
