Washington, May 9.-The passage of Washington, May 9.—The passage of the death sentence on the men caught on the fillbuster Competitor, it is star-ed, is liable to bring about a crisis in the relations between Spain and the United States. It is understood that this Government will not allow the executions to take place without an earnest and vigorous protest against the summary manner in which the trial was conducted. Of the five men convicted and sentenced, two are na-tive born American citizens, and a third, William Kinlea, described as an Englishman.
