FASTER BOATS WANTED. Commercial Agent Tripp, at Trinldad, writes to the Department of Trade and Commerce that the subsidized lines from St. John and Hallfax are regurarly on time, but that if Canada must get the full bene-fit of the West Indian trade, faster boats must be put on.
