Many Writs Issued Yesterday-The City is Defendant in a Suit Over Argument took place before the Divisional Court at Osgoode Hall yesterday afternoon in the appeal taken from a judgment dismissing a motion to continue the injunction obtained by Frank

Sterling, restraining the directors of the Diamond Match Company from mortgaging certain assets of the company, of which he is a creditor. The case goes on this

morning.

The Metallic Roofing Company issued a writ against the Corporation of the City of Toronto. A lot owned by the city adjoins the company's property on Dufferinsteet, and was leased by them at the beginning of the year, but notwithstanding the lease the plaintiffs say the city has continued to use the place as a storage yard, and the company is taking the action for damages for the retention and also to obtain possession.

The Canadian Express Company is being sued by George A. Campbell for \$5500 damages. He says that a parcei sent to thim from Chicago was wrongfully retained by the company.

The Toronto Junction Railway Company applied to have a judge instead of a jury hear the approaching trial of Mr. Kyle's suit for \$5000 damages for the death of lisson, Willie, in April dast. The motion will be renewed next week.

The court refused a like application in the suit in which the widow of William Gaudiche of 8t. Thomas is seeking damages from the Michigan Central Railway for the death of her husband.

The Master-in-Ordinary gave an order directing that the assets of the defunct Merchants' Life Insurance Co. be sold. Some formal evidence or claim was heard, and more will be heard. Sept. 17.

The Village of Weston was allowed to drop out of William Carson's suit against that corporation and the G.T.K. for \$5000 damages for injuries received while driving over a railway bridge within the village limits.
