FACTS RE RAILWAYS.

Domestic Statistician Johnson Finds That More Passengers Are Being Carried Than Ever Before. Ottawa, April 22.—(Special.)—Returns received from the 35 electric railways of Canada, Mr. George Johnson, the Dominion statistician, makes up the following table:—The total number of passengers carried in Canada increased to 681, or 49 more than the number in 1900. The number of miles of electric railway in Canada increased to 1,222.4 miles, an increase of 164 over 1900. The total receipts for the year were \$2,220,000, and the expenses \$2,200,000. The steam railways carried 17,122,103 passengers in 1900, 50 more than in 1900. The steam and electric railways transported 681,000 passengers in 1900, an increase of 49 over 1900.
