**WILL OF LATE MR. McCABE.**  
Left an Estate of Nearly \$200,000.—  
Many Bequests Announced.

William McCabe, late managing director of the North American Life Assurance Co. left an estate valued at \$183,313. The estate is made up of real estate, the net value of which has been estimated at \$44,044.57, life insurance \$29,143.35, banks and other stocks \$54,096, cash in hand \$3,495.47, securities for money \$6774.75, a large quantity of lands in the State of Florida, and a large number of shares of stock in the shore west of Bronte are a valuable part of the estate.

He bequeaths the balance is \$1290 to be divided among the clerical force of the head office of the North American Assurance Co. For five years following his death the subscriptions to charitable institutions in Toronto will be kept up.


He bequeaths to the Boys' Industrial Home at Mimico the sum of \$250, and to the Girls' Industrial Home, under the same management, the sum of \$100.

He bequeaths to the trustees of the High School or Collegiate Institute at Picton the sum of \$500, to be invested by them and the proceeds given annually, or at such longer intervals as said trustees may prefer, to the student of that institution, a native of the County of Prince Edward, Ont., who ranks highest on entering Toronto University, or if only one at any time enters, then to such one, if honor be obtained in at least one department during his residence, either in cash or in the form of a gold medal, as the student may prefer.

He bequeaths the sum of \$200 to the church wardens of the Church of St. Mary Magdalene in Picton for improvement of the church property, and after giving legacies to his nephews, William B. Taylor, B.A., LL.E., and Dr. W. S. Taylor, the property is devised to his executors upon trust.

The executors are directed to pay and discharge during life to his daughter, Miss McCabe, other sums also bequeathed apart for her benefit according to the contents of the will, and annuities to his mother, Catharine McCabe, who still survives, his sisters, Margaret Taylor and Mary A. Harris.

Mr. B. Taylor is appointed as solicitor to the estate. His summer residence on the lake shore at Bronte and the residence in Toronto, together with the furniture and effects pertaining thereto, are given to his daughter, Catharine McCabe, and his mother and sisters, while they desire to retain the same, together with the furniture and effects pertaining thereto.
