

In June, 1864, an expedition under General Chernaieff had been sent into General Chernaieff had been sent into that portion of what is now West Turkestan, which lay just across the then borders of Asiatic Russia. Tashkend had fallen in June, 1865. Just before Kouropatkin's arrival on the scene the important victory of Irjan had been won by 8000 Russians over 40,000 Bokharans, under their Emir. Kouropatkin participated in all the subsequent hostilities, which culminated in the capture of Samarcand, the Emir's capital. A treaty was concluded which left Bokhara politically free, but transferred Samarcand to fRussia


