He indorsed the policy of not calling for tenders, and denounced the notion of opposition obstruction, and was applauded again. There was no monopoly in the deal that he could see. "Another feature of this bill which gives me great pleasure," said the colonel, "is the fact that the two men who have this contract are two Canadian-born gentlemen." (Government cheers.) Now objections to the deal simply simmered down to this, that nine out of ten Conservative members had not read the contract. (Cheers.)
