Greater Toronto.

Take a look at the map below. It tells the story of Greater Toronto. It shows what has recently been annexed and what it is now proposed to annex.

The Avenue-road annex (to the north) and the Rosedale annex (also to the north) were taken in a few years ago.

Between these two is the Deer Park annex, now passed all the stages and due to be made part of the city on December 15 next, so that its residents may vote in the city election of January next. Notice further that this Deer Park annex touches the Town of North Toronto to the north and for the first time that town will be "contiguous" or touching the city. That will be a step to North Toronto coming in.

Now let us look at the other two towns, East Toronto to the east, and the City of West Toronto to the west. They wish to come in and are moving in that direction.

East Toronto "touches" Toronto at Woodbine-avenue. But only for a couple of hundred vards. West Toronto has a good deal over a mile of common boundary.

These towns (or town and city) can come in on a resolution of the town and of Toronto, confirmed by the Railway and Municipal Board. That is easy.

But between the eastern bound of Toronto (Greenwood-avenue) and East Toronto there are over two thousand acres of the township south of Danforth-avenue. You will see it in the map. The city council has done its share by authorizing the annexation of this bit. But inasmuch as this 2000 acres is not an "organized municipality" (a village or town) it can only come in by a majority of the property owners petitioning in favor of it. And it is just here and in Bracondale and Wychwood (to the north), as shown in the map, that the Hidden Hand gets in its work. The Hidden Hand is supposed to be the electric and traction interests that centre in the Toronto Railway and they have their agents out now getting property owners to sign against annexation. These agents are glib at talking the owners into signing by painting pictures of "the awful city taxation" that will come. And the people they get to sign are mostly persons who are not resident in the district, but merely

The next move is to secure the con-sent of a majority of the ratepayers of the section described.
