GOOD MUSIC COSTLY

But Mendelssohn Choir Will Have Small Surplus.

Altho the figures of the receipts and expenses of the Mendelssohn choir of concerts are not available, it is expected that there will be a surplus on the right side. The receipts from the sale of tickets for the five concerts were from \$21,000 to \$22,000, and the expenses will be about \$19,000, of which the Theodore Thomas Orchestra received about \$800.

Secretary Reid of the Mendelssohn choir, said whatever profit there was would be applied to the general fund to meet the expenses of another year. It was not the object of the choir to make money, but to run a series of concerts each year for the benefit of musical art. It is understood that Dr. Vort is paid an honorarium of \$500 a year. On the evening of the 14th, the choir will sing in Buffalo, and on

Tuesday and Wednesday nights following in Cleveland, Brahms' German Requiem will be sung in Cleveland.
