Provision for Increase in Pay of Toronto Policemen

That there is no provision made in the year's estimates for an increase in the pay of members of the Toronto Police Force, and that if an increase decided upon it could not be made effective for at least another three or four months, will be a serious matter.

The present salary of a policeman is \$900 for first year, and \$600 for the second year. After five years' service the salary is increased to \$1150. Seven per cent of this is deducted for the gratuity fund.
