Late General Manager Consumers' Gas Company Left \$207,351—No Charitable Bequests.

Probate of the will of the deceased W.

Probate of the will of the deceased W. H. Pearson, former general manager of the Consumers' Gas Co., who died on April 5 last, has been granted to the Na-tional Trust Company, the executors and trustees. Stocks held by the deceased are valued at \$109,997; bonds, \$58,035, and real estate, \$29,109. After providing legacies, ranging from \$1,000 to \$5,000, to his children and grandchildren, and an-ruities to other relatives, the testator directs that the residue of his estate is to be divided amongst his children and grandchildren. A clause in the will states that de-ceased makes no charitable bequests out of his estafé for the reason that for fifty years he regularly devoted one-tenth of his income to religious, charitable and benevolent purposes.




