**PRODUCTION OF COAL**  
THROUGHOUT THE WORLD

**Total Output for 1906 in all Countries Reached 905,000,000 Bushels.**

LONDON, Dec. 20.—A board of trade return issued here states that the total known production of coal throughout the world in 1906 was about 900,000,000 tons, the United Kingdom

Last year the United Kingdom exported 76,788,000 tons of coal, and Germany 25,807,000 tons. On the other hand, Germany imported 10,175,000 tons, of which 7,500,000 tons were obtained from this country. France and Italy are our other principal customers.

## SUFFRAGETTE HOWLED DOWN

Voice of Woman Drowned for Wh

LONDON, Dec. 20.—Extraordinary scenes were witnessed at a suffrage meeting at Nottingham the other night. Between two and three hundred students and bank clerks packed the gallery, and immediately Mr. Pankhurst rose they commenced

cheer, sing and blow whistles at the mouth organs. Not a moment's interval occurred. Miss Pankhurst stood her ground pluckily, but even the front rows could hear. After twenty minutes' uninterrupted uproar Ald. J. A. H. Green, mayor, went on the platform and

"As we hope to hear Mr. Asquith next week," he shouted, "hear Parkhurst to-night."

Mr. Green is a popular Liberal, and the students cheered him vociferously, and sang "He's a Jolly Good Fellow"; but they refused to be silenced.

"I presume you want to know what we have heard of Asquith," he said.
