Sir,

I have the honour to say that, in accordance with your instructions, I interviewed Chief Thunderchild and his Indians; but they ~~would~~ not say where they will locate their proposed new Reserve, until the Snow is off the ground. In talking the subject over, they incidentally mentioned that they very much wished the new Reserve to touch, at some point, Turtle Lake.

As soon as the Snow is off the ground, I am going with them to look for a suitable location; and will report to the Department, their choice, at the earliest moment possible.

I am returning the Map, as requested.
