

BRITISH NEWS.

LONDON, May 29.—The state of parliamentary business, it is supposed, will prevent their Majesty's Ministers from meeting till the 31st of this month.

It is confidently expected that some important alterations in the church law are seriously contemplated, and are, in fact, under consideration.

The sale of Tea by the East India Company commenced in London on the first of June, 8,300,000 lbs. were declared—the largest declaration ever before issued.

There are now in the end of Emus no less than 110 prisoners for trial, charged with "Terry Ains" for the approaching Corn Law.

SCOTLAND.—The result of the elections in Scotland has surprised us (says the Morning Chronicle) as it must have surprised many others besides.
