

In the fiscal year, 1909, we exported to Hong Kong goods to the value of \$794,838; to China, \$1,022,555; to Korea, \$15,257; to Japan, \$766,111; to Siam, \$65; to British East Indies, \$329,471; to Danish East Indies, \$7,143. The agent soon wrote back that it was useless to continue the agency, as the Chinese were so well satisfied with rice that they did not seem to care to change. 
