Miss Stevenson of Victorian Order of Nurses in Ontario Inspects Work in Saint John

MISS STEVENSON, district inspector of the Victorian Order of Nurses in Ontario, who about two years ago reorganized the system of records of the V. O. N. in Saint John, is being welcomed by many friends in the city. She has come to Saint John en route from other Maritime points to visit Marysville, and is a guest at the Admiral Beatty Hotel.

At the invitation of the local V. O. N. directorate she is staying over until this evening in order to attend their monthly meeting this afternoon, but will leave for Marysville this evening and will afterwards proceed to Ottawa.

TAKES OVER DUTIES
In the serious illness of Miss Bowell, Maritime district inspector, Miss Stevenson is taking over her duties temporarily and since the middle of November has visited Quebec, Montreal and Sackville, Pictou, Dartmouth, Digby and Yarmouth and organized a new V. O. N. centre in Lunenburg, Marysville will be the last Maritime centre to be visited on her present trip.

FAVORABLY IMPRESSED
While she has not had time to go thoroughly into the work being done in Saint John, and had not planned staying over here, Miss Stevenson was most favorably impressed with what she heard of the activities of the Saint John centre. She expressed herself as specially delighted with the prenatal work of the Victorian Order of Nurses here and felt that it must be far-reaching for good, as helping the mothers was the very beginning of child welfare. The child welfare work, she understood, was now being cared for by the department of health.

EDUCATIONAL WORK
She pointed out that the V. O. N. had fallen heir to a splendid opportunity for constructive work as, while visiting the mother, the nurses were able to do much educational work. She stressed the fact that if the V. O. N. did nothing but nursing work and all educational work were carried by another body there must be duplication of effort, and the mother would be inclined to resent having the home invaded by too many welfare workers. While the V. O. N. year ends with the calendar year, the work has not yet been made out of the activities of the order had been much strengthened and the work was being built up strongly in every district. Expansion had been considerable and the amount of work done for the expectant mother. There had been considerable growth in the opening of new districts.
