THE LINEN TRADE
Great Possibilities for Canada in the Growing of Flax.
(Toronto Globe)
Slackness in the linen trade has been reported in trade journals recently, with purchases demanding lower prices and producers unwilling to concede them. The situation has been described as anomalous, owing to the fact that the source of the raw material used in the linen industry is rapidly drying up, while a buying movement is liable to develop at any moment. Russia is out of the list of producers altogether, while most of the other producing countries report crop failures and diminished production.
This condition appears to be full of possibilities for the flax fibre industry in Canada. There is a tendency in some quarters to quote the present temporary stagnation in the flax market as a reason for curtailing Canadian activity in this regard. It is doubtful, however, if wisdom would suggest the affecting of the policy of the future development of the industry on this ground. When it is remembered that Russian production in Canada is many years before Russia can return on a large scale of fibre production, and Canada's advantage in this particular are claimed to be unique.
It is admitted that irrigated lands in Western Canada will produce a flax superior to the average Russian product, while Ontario grows a fibre which has been sold in competition with Belgian linen. Quebec and British Columbia, moreover, have lands and climate eminently suited to this crop.
The opportunity for developing the flax fibre industry here should not be passed by without careful study of its possibilities.
