

WANT PENALTY FOR VIOLATION

Proposal to Deal With Sardine Fishermen Breaking Agreement

Charlotte Meeting Recommends Standard Hogsheads—Saint John to Give Views

ST. ANDREWS, Jan. 16.—A recommendation that all sardine fisherman be required to measure their catches for export sale in standard hogsheads containing 101 tubs of 14 imperial gallons each, was unanimously adopted here today at a representative meeting of their fishermen from eastern and central Charlotte county.

In the latter part of the year, a period during which the greatest run of sardines ever recorded visited New Brunswick and Maine waters, New Brunswick fishermen sold hogsheads that contained more than the aforementioned quantity or otherwise disposed of their fish to United States packers at less than the required \$10 per hogshead price.

CONSIDER PENALTY ENOUGH.

Today's meeting recommended that anyone in future found guilty of a violation of the proposed regulation be deprived of his license for a year, a penalty which the meeting considered sufficient.

WANT PRICE CLAUSE.

The gathering, which was attended by about 50 fishermen, many of whom, having been kept away by the snow-blocked roads, voted unanimously in favor of the \$10 export price clause being continued as a condition in the license.

Majority of 3 Not Smallest One on Record

OTTAWA, Jan. 15.—The majority of three cast against the Conservative amendment is one of the slimmest on record, but there have been majorities still narrower. Last session the Speaker's casting vote was needed in one division, although it was only on a private member's motion. One of the budgets in the last parliament carried with only a majority of eight. There is also a tradition of one famous division years ago when the balance was swung on one vote—that of a sick member carried into the chamber in blankets.

Peak To Be Named Mount Lougheed

EDMONTON, Jan. 15.—Mount Lougheed is to be a new name on the map of the Rocky Mountain country, commemorating the name of the late Senator Lougheed.

The Geographic Board of Canada has advised its local representative that it has decided to name a hitherto nameless peak in the Banff district, lying northeast of Mount Bourgen, between Healy Creek and the Bow River, and a near neighbor of Mount Brett and Massive Mountain. It has a height of 8,850 feet.

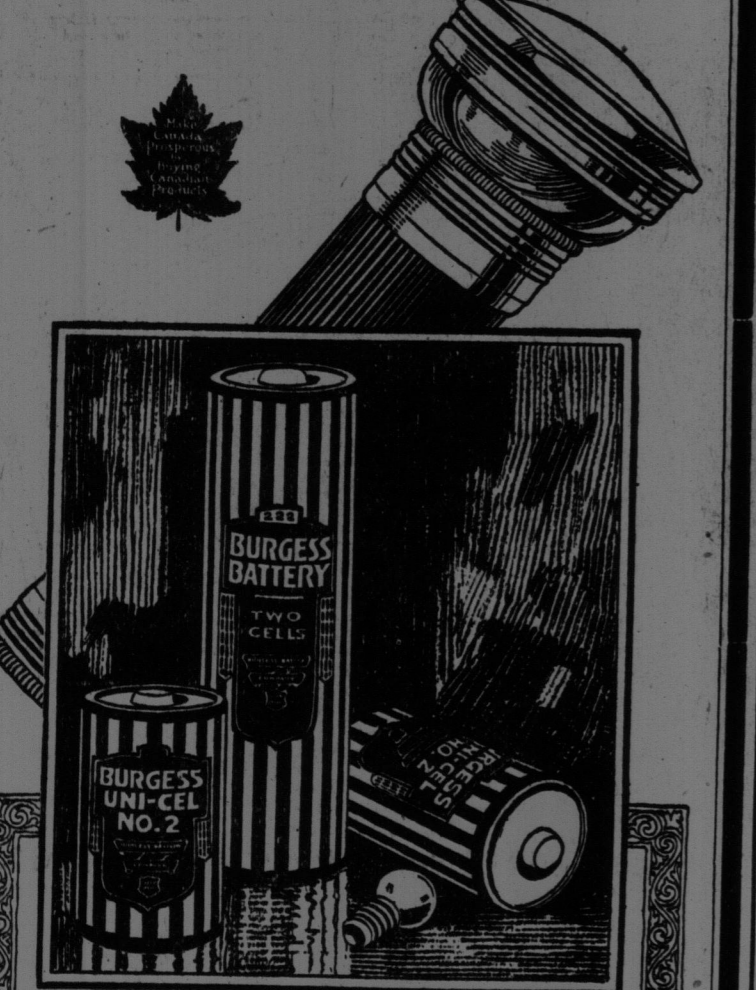
