Gloucester, Mass, Nov. 29—The three masted schooner, Harold B. Cousens, was wrecked at Brace's Cove, Cape Ann, today. Captain Carey and his crew of eight men were rescued in an exhausted condition, by the Gloucester coast guards. The schooner probably will be a total loss. She was bound from St. John, N. B., for New York, with a cargo of spruce lumber.
