Mr. H. Roddis was first here, looking for  
site to build his mill. He promised, that  
whatever buildings he will put up, he shall  
leave it all there, for the members of the  
Seabird Island Band.

For the last 3 years and a half, they have been  
cutting fir trees for firewood, but never a  
complaint from us. The Indian Department  
wrote to our Chief saying the Mill Co. was to  
cut and burn only cedar tops for firewood  
and none other. You see, the reason why we never  
made a complaint before about this firewood  
is because they promised to leave us those  
buildings, after their time is expired from here.  
We would be very much obliged to them, if  
they keep their promise, and we will drop the  
matter of the firewood, and save more  
trouble in the future. We would thank  
you very much for your assistance on this  
matter.
